- constitutional republic
- ranked among one of the most stable democracies in Africa
- extended stable period among its African peers in terms of geopolitical and investment stability
- liberal society, free media and strong state institutions have facilitated 5 separate democratic transfers of power between multiple political parties
- current Government policies designeed to create business friendly environment

- Ghana had the world's fastest growing economy in 2017
- Ghana's economy has grown at an average rate of 5.5% over the last 5 years ending December 2017
- it is expected to grow 6.3% in 2018

> 70% construction material in Ghana are imported





Building successful business is as much about relationships as it is about money




