FEDIL wants more women

The largely industrial employers association FEDIL launched on 22nd September an action plain aimed at increasing the number of women in all levels of business and industry. "Gender balance is a very important theme for FEDIL because we consider it added-value for companies," said FEDIL president Robert Dennewald. The plan will include a series of conferences between February and March 2012 on the advantages of gender balance. There will also be a new structure to help exchange best practice. The impact of the plan will be

evaluated by scientific researchers . A study commissioned by the association revealed that only 17.5% of top managers in industry were women, along with only 39% of the workforce. Equal Opportunities Minister Françoise Hetto-Gaasch. was on hand for the plan's announcement. While Dennewald expressed firm opposition to governmentimposed quotas, the minister said such proposed measures will remain on the table unless a two-year review, backed by numbers, proves the effectiveness of the plan.
